

I'd served 2 tours of duty as an Army nurse (68-69 and 70-71). The memorabilia included dogtags, my Boonie Hat worn my 2nd tour and to subsequent peace marches over the years, a plaque recognizing my service at the 24th Evac., photo albums, and a scrapbook kept during my 1st tour in Qui Nhon. It contained numerous photos, MPCs (Military Pay Certificates), articles, evac rosters, a personal letter from Bob Hope and Dec. 1968 letters I received and distributed on my intensive care ward from Mrs. Jones 6th grade class (6C0. My sister Debbie was in Mrs. Jones' class and I shared the letters with many GIs - patients, as well as nurses and corpsmen).

The letters made us all smile! I just wanted to let you all know that Gibson City has a place in 'Our Nation's Attic'.
